## GUEST TICKETS

We will also be trialling an electronic guest ticket which can be held on your phone and the image can be shown to bailiffs / other members when requested. If you do not have this facility we can still issue paper guest tickets but these will take a bit longer to process. You will be able to pay for guest tickets by cheque or Bacs, we will give you more information when you apply. We would ask that you request guest tickets at least a week in advance to allow us to process your requests and ensure we get the tickets to you.

## ROD LICENCES

We would remind you again that you must have the appropriate Environment Agency rod licences with you when you are fishing. These can be obtained online or from post offices.

## AROUND OUR WATERS

### STILL WATERS

After a warm April we have had a fairly dismal rain soaked and wind battered May.

### PETWORTH PARK

Well we always say that Petworth Park fishes best with a breeze on the water but we had a bit more than a breeze for a lot of May. This does not appear to have deterred either anglers or fish. Bream catches have been excellent and if you get a bit of groundbait in, no matter where you are, the fish are coming to you. Feeder tactics are favoured and go around 30 metres out, this is the most consistent area. However don't neglect an inside line along the road side, if you locate the bottom of the drop off which is around 5 - 8 metres out depending where you are you can also pick up plenty of fish here as well. This inside line tends to be favoured by the Tench and Crucian Carp so well worth trying with float or pole tactics for some variety.

### HURSTON LANE

Spawning has been taking place intermittently over the last month at Hurston, but the warm weather over the last few days of May certainly increased activity with both the Bream and Carp being very active. Things should settle down a bit now and the fish will be more interested in a bait an each other!

Despite the spawning activity Keith our Bailiff has reported good catches from all three ponds, however if the Tench Pond is your target he recommends running a rake through your swim before you get started. This really seems to bring the Tench on and can make the difference between a mediocre and good session

### THE GRANARY

During the variable weather that we experienced in May, fishing at the Granary has been a bit up and down, with some days when even the Rudd have been slow to bite and little or no Carp activity. On other days when the weather was a bit more settled and the sun was putting a bit of warmth into the water both Rudd and Carp has responded well to normal tactics. With steady temperatures and a fair amount of sun forecast for the next few weeks the Granary should fish well during June.

### STEMPS & CART

Both ponds are reported as fishing well, however we are aware of an increasing weed and silt problem in Cart. In the next few weeks we will be having the pond surveyed with a view to bringing in specialists to carry out work to remove the silt and weed. This will inevitably lead to some closure of the water. Please keep an eye out for announcements on the website, our facebook page and the venue notice board.

### OUR RIVERS

We are sure that a lot of you are gearing up for the start of the river coarse season which is now just a couple of weeks away. Our bailiffs and volunteers have been hard at work at both Coultershaw and Shopham over the last month and you can see the results of their activities on our website. There is a final work party at Coultershaw on Sunday June 13th (apologies the date in the handbook is incorrect). If you can make it I'm sure Martin will be able to find you plenty to do. Please bring gardening tools such as spades, forks, loppers, garden shears and secateurs.
